



Get knitting with Australian wool!

There's never been a better time to pick up a pair of knitting needles, order some Australian wool yarn, and knit a present for yourself or your loved ones.

This pattern for a ribbed beanie was designed by 2018 International Woolmark Prize finalist Kathleen Kye. But don't worry, it is suitable for novice knitters!

When you have finished with this pattern, pass it on to a friend, family member or a city cousin - and don't forget to tell them to use the world's greatest fibre, Australian wool!

MATERIALS



• For the 52cm and 54cm Beanie: 100gr **

KNITTING PATTERN

- For the 56cm and 58cm Beanie: 150gr **
- A set of 4mm (UK 6) double-pointed knitting needles (DPN) or one 4mm (UK 6) 80cm circular Needle for the Magic Loop method.
- Wool needle for sewing in ends.
- Stitch Marker
- Row counter or row counting App.



SKILLS REQUIRED

Check your head measurement carefully. You don't want it too tight and you don't want it too loose.

Knit and purl stitching

To fit head 52cm (54, 56, 58)

- Cast on
- Cast off
- Increases and decreases
- Working in the round



ABBREVIATIONS

beg = begin, beginning; **cm** = centimetres; **K** = knit; P = purl; rep = repeat; st/s = stitch/es; stocking st = knit right side rows, purl wrong side rows; tog = together, PM - Place marker, SM - Slip Marker, * = start of row

Let's get Started!

Using the **set** of 4.00mm **double-pointed** needles, or 4.00mm **Circular Needle**, cast on **104** (112-**120**-128) sts. Consider using a cast on method such as a Long tail cast on or Jenny's stretchy cast on to allow the garment to stretch if required.

Join to work in rounds, taking care not to twist cast on edge. **PM.**

1st round - * K2, P2, rep from * to end. SM

Rep 1st round until work measures **16** (18-**20**-22) cm from beg. Remember to slip your Marker at the end of each round.

If you would like to double over your brim, add the desired additional length before continuing to shape the crown. ** Remember that adding length will require additional yarn.



STEP







Let's begin to decrease the stitches.

1st round * K2, P2, K2, P2tog, rep from * to end

... 91 (98-105-112) sts. SM

2nd **round** * K2, P2, K2, P1, rep from * to end. SM

3rd round As 2nd round. SM

4th **round** * K2, P2tog, K2, P1, rep from *

to end ... 78 (84-90-96) sts. SM

5th **round** * K2, P1, rep from * to end. SM

6th **round** As 5th round. SM

7th **round** * K2, P1, K2tog, P1, rep from *

to end ... 65 (70-75-80) sts. SM

8th **round** * K2, P1, K1, P1, rep from *

to end. SM

9th **round** As 8th round. SM

10th **round** * K2tog, P1, K1, P1, rep from *

to end ... 52 (56-60-64) sts. SM

11th round * K1, P1, rep from * to end. SM

12th round As 11th round. SM

13th round K1, * K2tog, rep from * to last st,

knit last st of round and first st of next round tog ... 26 (28-30-32) sts.

14th round * K2tog, rep from * to end ...

13 (14-15-16) sts.

15th **round** * K2tog, rep from * to last 1 (0-1-0)

sts, K1 (0-1-0) ... 7 (7-8-8) sts. SM

Break off yarn, run end through remaining sts, draw up tightly and fasten off securely.

O FINISH



Sew/weave in ends. Fold brim onto right side.



TO SHAPE THE CROWN



Follow the yarn manufacturer's washing and care instructions. Always lay flat to dry to avoid overstretching of the beanie.
